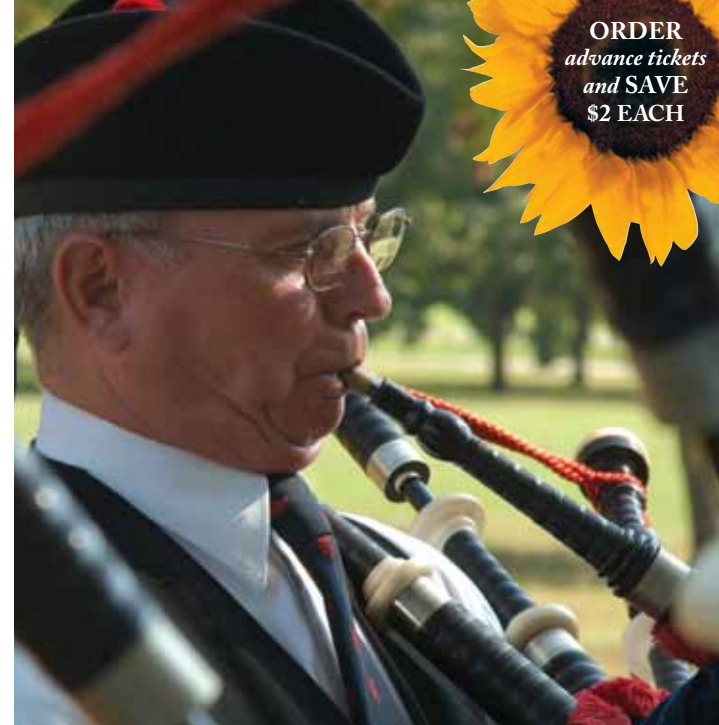

Saturday & Sunday | Lakeside Park

Festival Parking and Shuttle Service.

Park free at McPherson High School, 801 East First St. at North High Drive. Free shuttle to festival, runs Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., or walk from the High School to the festival grounds.

To reach the festival parking and shuttle service: From the north or south, take exit 60 from I-135 and travel west on Kansas Ave. (US 56). Turn right on Maxwell and left on First Street.

From the west, take U.S. 56 East which becomes Kansas Avenue in McPherson. Continue east approximately 1 mile past Main Street to Maxwell; turn left on Maxwell and left on First Street.



For reserved and handicapped parking (with a valid permit), from Kansas Ave. go north on Hartup, then east on Simpson to the Water Park lot near Festival Gate A.
